## ***Disabled Hunter Road Access Entry Program & Drawing***

The Road Access Entry Program provides access to hunters with lower extremity mobility disabilities into areas with fewer barriers and vehicle distraction.

This is a cooperative effort between the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW), Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO), Department of Natural Resources (DNR), U.S. Forest Service (USFS), private timber companies, and hunters with disabilities.

This is **NOT** the same as the special permit drawings offered each year in the “*Big Game Hunting Seasons and Regulations*” booklet. This is **NOT** a permit drawing for deer or elk tag, doe or cow tag.

If drawn, you will be issued an access special use permit by the land manager allowing you to drive a motorized vehicle into a closed or gated area where other hunters must walk in.

### **All areas are:**

- **still open to walk-in hunters.**
- **open to administrative use by the agency or land manager.**
- **subject to logging, fire and emergency closures... etc.**

You do **NOT** have to buy your license or tags first to apply for these Road Access Entry Permits; you need to be a WDFW registered hunter with a permanent lower extremity mobility disability and have your Disabled Hunter Wild ID number available. (***This number is on your orange placard.***)

***However, if drawn for a Road Access Entry Permit, you must have all appropriate licenses and tags for the game you are pursuing.***

***Everyone must follow all state regulations pertaining to hunting.***

### ***How to apply:***

Application submissions begin the first week of June. You must fill out an official WDFW application form for deer and/or elk and return it to the mailing address on page 6 or submit one online by **July 31, 2014** in order to be eligible for the drawing.

***Note: Only one application form per hunter is allowed. If you submit more than one entry form you will not be able to participate in the drawing and your entry forms will be destroyed.***

Please read where the Road Access Areas are located and apply only for those areas you would actually travel to should you be drawn.

If applying for elk, the west side and east side elk tags are different and you must hunt in compliance with your tags and equipment.

Game Management Unit (GMU) numbers for the Road Access Entry Areas are listed at the top of each page for your convenience.

## Qualifying Program Criteria - Hunter with a Lower Extremity Mobility Disability

**To apply for this ADA accommodation, you must meet the following criteria:**

1. Have WDFW disability status in good standing, **and**
2. Have a permanent non-operable lower extremity mobility impairment, **and**
3. WAC 232-12-825(1)(a): Have been medically prescribed the use of an assistive device every time for mobility, including, but not limited to, a wheelchair, walker, crutch, lower extremity prosthesis, or oxygen bottle, **or**
4. RCW 46.19.010(1)(a-j): Have been issued a DOL disability parking permit, **or**
5. Unable to walk more than 200 feet.

RCW 46.19.010(1)(a-j) DOL disability parking permit criteria:

- (a) Cannot walk two hundred feet without stopping to rest;
- (b) Is severely limited in ability to walk due to arthritic, neurological, or orthopedic condition;
- (c) Has such a severe disability that the person cannot walk without the use of or assistance from a brace, cane, another person, prosthetic device, wheelchair, or other assistive device;
- (d) Uses portable oxygen;
- (e) Is restricted by lung disease to an extent that forced expiratory respiratory volume, when measured by a spirometer, is less than one liter per second or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty mm/hg on room air at rest;
- (f) Impairment by cardiovascular disease or cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified as class III or IV under standards accepted by the American heart association;
- (g) Has a disability resulting from an acute sensitivity to automobile emissions that limits or impairs the ability to walk. The personal physician, advanced registered nurse practitioner, or physician assistant of the applicant shall document that the disability is comparable in severity to the others listed in this subsection;
- (h) Has limited mobility and has no vision or whose vision with corrective lenses is so limited that the person requires alternative methods or skills to do efficiently those things that are ordinarily done with sight by persons with normal vision;
- (i) Has an eye condition of a progressive nature that may lead to blindness; or
- (j) Is restricted by a form of porphyria to the extent that the applicant would significantly benefit from a decrease in exposure to light.

***If you meet the above criteria, then proceed forward...***

## ***FILLING OUT THE SUBMISSION FORM:***

You have up to four (4) Elk and four (4) Deer road choices. Fill out the submission form with the entry number(s) for the road area(s) you would like to drive into.

Enter the number listed under the “**Entry Number**” column into the choice box on the submission form. ~ **Do not use the “GMU” number** ~ *If GMU’s are entered then the form will be destroyed.*

**Entry Numbers** are separated into two groups:

**The “D” is for Deer hunts - example: D 173**

**The “E” is for Elk hunts - example: E 285**

Please print your Name, full mailing Address, Telephone number with area code and your Wild ID number (*found on your orange placard*) clearly onto the form.

**Your Wild ID number must appear on the entry form to qualify for the drawing.**

If you want to be considered as an alternate, check the “*alternate*” box. If there are areas left over, wherever possible, we will match unsuccessful hunters with disabilities to an area close to their preferred choices by geographic location.

## ***DRAWING NOTIFICATION:***

Hunters who have been drawn will be notified no later than **August 31, 2014**.

- **Hunters with disabilities who are not drawn will “NOT” be notified.**

**Those who were drawn will receive information including:**

- Congratulation letter
- The Road Access Entry Area for which they were drawn, and
- Instructions on how to obtain the entry special use permit, key, map... etc.

You may be required to visit the land managers office in person at a specific time to pick up a key, sign papers, and leave a check for a key deposit.

***Designated Hunting Companion*** - Hunting areas have different rules about whether the hunter companion can also hunt on their own tag, or must only **assist** the disabled hunter in the harvest.

Successfully drawn hunters with disabilities and their designated hunting companions must follow the rules of the land manager while hunting and driving in the permit area. You will receive a list of these rules when you receive your Road Access Entry Special Use Permit.

If allowed on the entry special use permit, other non-hunting persons or family members besides your hunting companion may be allowed to accompany the hunter with a disability. Each land manager makes this decision, so check before you go.

**Other Road Systems** for hunters with disabilities not requiring participation in this drawing are available. For more details see the section **“Other Road Access Opportunities”** in the back of this road access catalog.

**NOTE:** Please notify the ADA Access Program Manager as soon as possible if you are unable to use the permit drawn. This allows the permit to be reissued to an alternate. Also, contact the ADA Access Program Manager at (360) 902-2349, if you have an *address and/or telephone number change*.

### **TIPS FOR HUNTERS WITH DISABILITIES DRAWN FOR A ROAD ENTRY PERMIT:**

**If you are successfully drawn for a Road Access Entry permit, please follow the instructions on the letter you will receive. The letter will describe how to obtain your key or combination and other documents needed for entry into the gated access entry area.**

#### **PLEASE...**

- Be courteous to the staff where you pick up your key. They did not pick these areas or start the Road Access Entry Program. They are graciously providing these keys and supplying the paperwork as a courtesy to you, the hunter.
- Do not share stories and consume their time when getting your key.
- Do not call or seek any other information from the land manager, unless the letter instructs you to do so.
- Have your Disabled Hunter Permit (**orange** placard) with you.
- Return the key and required paperwork when your hunting time is up.

Follow all hunting regulations, rules, instructions and procedures of the Road Access Entry Special Use Permit and land manager so you and other hunters with disabilities will be welcomed back.

#### **REMEMBER...**

- Access into these drawing entry areas does not guarantee hunting success. Your entry permit simply allows you to drive a vehicle into an area other hunters walk into. All other state hunting laws apply to you. Other vehicle traffic may be allowed in the area for other reasons than hunting. Other hunters with disabilities may be in the area at the same time. There are no guarantees that someone will not trespass into the area and be there illegally. Everyone has different expectations of what makes a quality hunt, but the areas provided should offer a good chance of seeing game, with minimal interference from other hunters and vehicles.
- **Signs or gates may be vandalized. Gates and/or locks may be damaged due to vandalism and may prevent you from entering the area you are assigned. If this occurs, WDFW cannot guarantee you will be able to use your entry special use permit at your assigned time.**

If you suspect a vehicle is trespassing, **DO NOT ENDANGER YOURSELF**. Instead, note a description of the vehicle, persons involved, license plate number, time, place, etc. and notify the Land Manager and/or Law Enforcement as soon as possible.

**Entry Numbers** are separated into two groups:


**The "D" is for Deer hunts - example: D 173**

# WDFW Cowlitz Wildlife Area

Peterman Ridge Unit GMU 505

## WDFW Cowlitz Wildlife Area (GMU 505)

The 6,840 acre Peterman Ridge Unit is located south of Morton in Lewis County. Owned by Tacoma Power and managed by WDFW, this area is home to black-tailed deer. From Highway 12 near Morton, turn south onto Highland Valley Road. Stay up hill to Peterman Hill Road, the entry point is at the 1500 Road. Access to over 7 miles of Mainline Road. All permits must be displayed. ATV's allowed at this site. No off-road travel. Camping is available at Ike Kinswa State Park on Mayfield Lake. One non-hunting person in addition to the Hunter and Hunter Companion is allowed to help.

# WDFW Scatter Creek Wildlife Area

## Skookumchuck GMU 667



### WDFW Scatter Creek Puget Sound (Skookumchuck) Wildlife Area (GMU 667)

The 960 acre Skookumchuck Unit is managed by and on TransAlta's private property located eleven miles NE of Centralia and downstream from the Skookumchuck Dam in Thurston County. On Hwy 507, go south of Tenino towards Bucoda 2.3 miles and turn left (east) onto 184<sup>th</sup> Ave SE, which becomes Skookumchuck Rd. SE. Proceed **5.4** miles and turn right (south) onto Thompson Creek Rd SE. Proceed **1.0** miles to TransAlta's Gate #17 on the left just past BPA's transmission lines. This road is **1.9** miles long. Deer and Elk move into and through this security cover from forage fields on the north side of the river and meadows on the south side. This access is for the south side of the Skookumchuck River and for **Elk** only. ATV's, target shooting, and overnight camping are not permitted on the habitat area. Camping is available at Millersylvania State Park. Hunters may bring one hunter companion to help.

## Prevent Wildfires

Only dispose of lit smoking materials in ashtrays or cup of water, so that they will not ignite another source.



Burning of any material, except firewood, is prohibited.



**No fireworks.**  
Fireworks are not allowed on DNR-protected lands.



AT DNR CAMPGROUNDS, USE APPROVED FIRE PITS ONLY



**NEVER LEAVE A FIRE UNATTENDED.**

**Never park vehicles, including recreational vehicles, on dry vegetation.**  
The exhaust system can get hot enough to start a fire.

Keep a shovel and water close at hand when a campfire is burning. Use water to drown the campfire, and use a shovel to stir the coals to cool it down. Repeat as needed. **Completely extinguish the fire before you leave.**



# DNR Capitol Forest

DC Line Road GMU 663

**Capitol State Forest - DC Line Road (GMU 663)** Located in the Capitol Forest between Porter and Oakville opposite of State Route 12 – Mile Post 31. Approximately 20 miles of road accessing good views of both timber and cut over areas. Be extremely cautious. Logging maybe occurring on this road and there could be brush pickers. ATV's are allowed. No camping.

**DNR Cassidy Creek PA-L 1000 Road (GMU 621)** From Sequim on Highway 101 travel 2.1 miles west to Hooker Rd. Turn left and travel .3 miles to Atterbury Rd. Turn right and travel 2.1 miles to Cassidy Rd. Turn left and travel 1.1 miles to the gate. No overnight camping. ATV use allowed.

## Non-Motorized Trail Use on DNR-managed Lands

DNR-managed lands provide opportunities for multi-use recreation activities. Some areas limit recreation use to specific activities and are posted.

**BE SAFE. ALWAYS WEAR A HELMET**



**Control your mountain bike.** Inattention for even a moment could put you and others at risk. Ride within your limits and abilities.

**Yield appropriately.** Let your fellow trail users know you're coming. Bicyclists must yield to other non-motorized trail users.

**YIELD**



**Know more about the dirt you're on.** Wet and muddy trails are more vulnerable to damage than dry trails.



**Leave no trace.** It is illegal to build trails without approval from DNR.



**All recreation activities must yield to horses and animals.** Downhill travel has right-of-way.



**Never scare wildlife.** Animals easily startle at sudden movement or loud noises. Give animals enough room and time to adjust to you.





# DNR Elbe Hills

## GMU 654

**Elbe Hills (GMU 654)** From Elbe continue East toward Ashford on Highway 706 for 6.1 miles. Turn left onto 278<sup>th</sup> Ave East and follow .6 miles to the end of the county road. Continue left for 2 miles. Stay left for 1.8 miles to Beaver Creek Trailhead. The gate is around a sharp left hand turn (not visible from the main road). There is approximately 9.25 miles to explore behind the gate. No ATV's allowed. Overnight camping is allowed. Discover Pass Required.

### DNR Hood Canal State Forest (GMU 621)

From Highway 101 and Jorsted Creek Road (Forest Service 24 Road) follow 2.1 miles to the junction of FS 2480 and FS 24 Roads. Turn left onto FS24 and follow for 2.9 miles. Turn left onto FS 2420 to the gate. There are several large thinning units behind the gate. No overnight camping. Street legal vehicles on roads only. Discover Pass Required.

## Target Shooting on DNR-managed Lands

 Target shooting is allowed **ONLY** in areas with an unobstructed, earthen backstop that can safely stop all projectiles and debris. Some areas may be designated or posted as "no shooting."

**Pack out what you pack in.** Pack out all shells, brass, paper, and other debris.



 No shooting within 500 feet of a recreation site or structure.



Unless otherwise posted, target shooting is not allowed 1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise.



No shooting from across, along, or down roads or trails.



Use paper targets only.

**SHOOT ONLY IN AREAS WITH UNOBSTRUCTED, EARTHEN BACKSTOP.**

# DNR Tahuya State Forest

Cougar 1000 Road GMU 633



## Tahuya State Forest – Cougar 1000 Road (GMU 633)

This is a 2,500 acre working forest on the southeastern portion of Hood Canal. ### You Can Make a Difference and Make a Statement with Personalized License Plates

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) launched a "Make A Difference – Make A Statement" campaign that is aimed at increasing public awareness of our state's Personalized License Plate program. Proceeds from the sale of personalized license plates directly benefit Washington's wildlife species and their natural habitat. By buying personalized license plates, Washington vehicle owners support wildlife research, recovery efforts, and viewing opportunities for wildlife species such as bald eagles, burrowing owls, Columbian white-tailed deer, and spotted frogs.

Personalized plates are available for Washington passenger vehicles for \$49.75, with a yearly renewal fee of \$32. Forty dollars of the initial purchase, and the entire \$32 renewal fee, help conserve wildlife species through WDFW's Wildlife Program. Personalized license plates allow motorists to "Make A Statement" while they "Make a Difference" for Washington's wildlife.

## WDFW Methow Wildlife Area - Riser Lake (GMU 218)

The 4,225 acre Rendezvous Unit is located in north central Washington near the town of Winthrop. The habitat is mostly rolling hills covered with sage brush, with draws containing scattered pine and aspen trees. Mule deer are the most abundant big game species in this area, but one might also come across whitetail deer. From the town of Winthrop, drive north 1 mile on West Chewach road. Turn left onto Rendezvous Road and go 1.3 miles to Gunn Ranch Road. Turn left and drive 1 mile on Gunn Ranch Road until arriving at the Riser Lake access gate. Turn left to enter the parking area. This area includes graveled parking and a vault toilet. Both ATV's and street legal vehicles are authorized for this area. Camping at Riser Lake is not allowed, but beautiful Pearygin Lake State Park is within 5 miles of town. Pedestrians near, be sure of your shot.

## Discover Pass



The Discover Pass is your ticket to millions of acres of state lands managed by WDFW, the Washington Department of Natural Resources, and Washington State Parks. Your purchase of a Discover Pass helps to keep recreation access open on these state lands.

You don't need a Discover Pass to hunt and fish on WDFW-managed lands. When you purchase a hunting or fishing license, you also receive a complimentary Vehicle Access Pass that gives you access to hunt and fish on WDFW-managed lands.

However, to hunt on many DNR managed lands and to fish on DNR managed lands AND state parks, you will need a Discover Pass. (Hunting is not allowed in state parks.)

The Discover Pass is just \$30 per year and can be switched between two vehicles. A day-use pass is \$10. (Transaction fees may apply)




## Vehicle Access Pass

You must clearly display a Vehicle Access Pass (VAP) to park a vehicle at all posted WDFW wildlife areas and water access sites. The VAP must be visible from outside the vehicle (they can be placed on the dash or hung from the rear-view mirror) and can be switched between two vehicles. You can get a rear-view mirror hanger from your local license dealer.

Your Vehicle Access Pass is free with the purchase of an annual hunting, fishing, or trapping license. It cannot be purchased separately. Your Vehicle Access Pass can be switched between two motor vehicles.

## USFS Bear Mountain GMU 224



### WDFW Methow Wildlife Area - Bear Mountain USFS (GMU 224)

Bear Mountain (USFS) is located on U.S. Forest Service property near the Loup Loup summit off of State Route 20. Twisp is approximately 12 miles from this site. This area is characterized by rolling hills with mixed Ponderosa Pine and Douglas Fir forest with a shrubby understory. Bear Mountain has an extensive road network. Mule deer and black bear are the big game species found in the area. From State Route 20 at the Loup Loup summit, go north on Forest Service Road 42. At 0.6 miles from the highway, USFS Road 42 will veer right. Continue on USFS 42 for another 3 miles until the pavement ends. Access to the Bear Mountain site is on the left. Camping facilities, including vault toilets are available at nearby USFS campgrounds. Only street legal vehicles are authorized. ATV's are prohibited.

## Motorized Trail Use on DNR-managed Lands



**RIDE ONLY ON TRAILS DESIGNATED FOR YOUR TYPE OF OFF-ROAD VEHICLE**

**Protect the environment and natural resources.** Stay on designated roads and trails.

**Tread lightly.** It is illegal to build trails without approval from DNR.

**Children under 13** may operate an off-road vehicle on a non-highway road designated for off-road vehicles if they are directly supervised by a person 18 years of age or older with a valid license.



**NEVER RIDE WITH A CHILD IN FRONT OF THE DRIVER.**

Never ride an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) with a passenger unless the vehicle is certified for two riders.

Working and approved spark arresters are required on all motorcycles and ATVs.

**OFF-ROAD VEHICLE REGISTRATION**

**Vehicle registration.** All off-road vehicles must have current tabs and stickers.



Seatbelts are required for 4x4 use.




**DOT-approved helmets are required.** For extra safety, consider wearing a full-face helmet and other protective gear.

Inspect your gear before you ride.

Off-road vehicles must be registered in the state where the user resides.

## Camping on DNR-managed State Trust Lands

### OBSERVE STAY LIMITS

Stay limits vary at each campground. If not posted at campground or on DNR's website, maximum stay is 10 days in a 30-day time period.

Unless posted, all campsites are first-come, first-served. Saving campsites is not allowed.

Dispersed camping may be allowed outside of developed recreation facilities. When camping outside of designated areas, locate your campsite at least **200 feet from streams** and other water resources, and camp on durable surfaces. Camping is not allowed in some areas, such as those posted as "day use only."



Quiet hours: After 10 p.m. and before 7 a.m.

Campfires are permitted in approved fire pits only. Completely extinguish the fire before you leave.

Hunters with disabilities drawn for this access must check in at the Maintenance Building office before their hunt. There is no access of any kind within 300 feet of wind turbines, solar panels, buildings, or substation. No pointing or shooting any weapon at any target other than legal game. The hunting party must drive on site access road only. One hunter with a disability and one hunter companion allowed. No ATV's. No camping on-site. No off-road driving.

This is a gated road system of approximately 17 miles which accesses private timber company and National Forest lands under a road use cost share agreement. Respect private property. Street legal motorcycles are also permitted on this road system. Access may be denied during high fire danger or logging operations.

**Priest Lake Ranger District (GMU 113)** Priest Lake Ranger District is located in the northern Idaho Panhandle. The entire shoreline of Upper Priest Lake is managed by USFS. From here, Priest River flows south and was famous in the early days as a log-drive stream moving 125,000,000 board feet of timber. This Washington hunt is accessed via the lower Wild and Scenic River system north of the Pend Oreille River. Camping is available outside the gate. Only the hunter companion and one non-hunting helper is allowed to assist the hunter with a disability during this access. No ATV's permitted.

**Butch Creek (GMU 113) in Washington** - From Priest River, Idaho go North on State Highway 57.

At approximately 8.6 miles take a left on the Bearpaw road # 305. Proceed on the Bearpaw road, to the state line, approximately 6.2 miles, where you will enter back into Washington. At approximately 1 mile from the state line, turn left on Forest Service road #1084. Proceed approximately .7 mile to the Butch Creek road #1142 and you will see the Gate on the designated ADA hunting road. This road is not maintained.

**The Swanson Lakes Wildlife Area WDFW (GMU 136) provides two access areas:**

The Roloff Unit is located in the center of the Wildlife Area, about ten miles south of the town of Creston. The habitat is mostly shallow alkaline soils covered with sage brush, native bunchgrasses, and a few groves of aspens usually found in conjunction with shallow, seasonal alkali ponds. Mule deer are the predominant big game species. Coyotes are also abundant. Gray partridge are the primary hunted upland game birds. Hunters must be completely certain of their upland bird species before shooting; it is illegal to shoot native sage grouse and sharp-tailed grouse, both present on the Wildlife Area. Both ATVs and street legal vehicles are authorized for trail use only for this portion of the Wildlife Area.

The Welch/Anderson Unit is located on the east side of the Wildlife Area, about eight miles south of the Telford Rest Area on U.S. Highway 2. The rest area is located between the towns of Davenport and Creston. The habitat is mostly shallow alkaline soils covered with sage brush, native bunchgrasses, and a few groves of aspens usually found in conjunction with shallow, seasonal alkali ponds. However, the Lake Creek drainage runs through this parcel, including the informally named mile-long “Z Lake,” which contains a seasonal population of waterfowl, and a fishable population of planted rainbow trout. Mule deer are the predominant big game species. Coyotes are abundant, but difficult to spot during the day. Gray partridge are the primary hunted upland game birds. Hunters must be completely certain of their upland bird species before shooting; it is illegal to shoot native sage grouse and sharp-tailed grouse, both present on the Wildlife Area. Access is provided via a gated driveway to an abandoned home site, off Telford Road North, heading downhill to the drainage. The entry road has an informal parking area 1/3 mile down the hill, where the gravel driveway ends and a trail starts north. There are no restroom facilities. Both ATVs and street legal vehicles are authorized for trail use only for this portion of the Wildlife Area. Trails will take the visitor to the south edge of Z Lake, and to a short cliff along the east side of the lake.

**West Branch Little Spokane Wildlife Area WDFW (GMU 117) provides one access area:**

Through a locked gate off the corner of Horseshoe Lake Road and Holly Road. This intersection is accessed from U.S. Hwy 2 off the Eloika Lake Road. The trail, which continues northeast off the noted corner, eventually delivers the driver to a parking site, an abandoned dairy just north of Fan Lake. Drivers should take care to stay on the uphill side of the trail while traveling to and from the parking area, as there is continuing erosion around a culvert on the downhill side of the trail. There are no restroom facilities at this Wildlife Area. The habitat is composed primarily of upland forest, with some meadow openings. The West Branch Little Spokane River also runs through this property, providing fishing opportunities. Hunted species include white-tailed deer, forest grouse, and turkey. Beyond the parking area at the dairy, ATVs are the only authorized motorized vehicles, and they must stay on established trails. This Wildlife Area has an extensive trail network; however, some of the trails may be blocked off to access, and the fords across the river are not always passable. Crossing the river at locations other than established fords is prohibited.

The NE Washington Wildlife Area Complex Manager limits authorized travel at all of these access areas. Only the hunter with a Disabled Hunter Permit and the designated hunting companion (while accompanying the hunter with a disability) may operate the vehicle or be transported on/in it. No vehicular camping is allowed at any of these areas.

For reservations, rules, and other information about Swanson Lakes and West Branch Little Spokane Wildlife Area, call the Manager at (509) 636-2344 in advance.



### **Cle Elum Ranger District (GMU 328)**

Camping allowed – prepare for snowy conditions – between 4000-6000 elevations.

Table Mountain can be accessed from the south from Highway 97 near Ellensburg and from the north – from Highway 97 at Blewett Pass. The southern route, locally known as Reecer Creek, starts out on a two lane paved road with turnouts and climbs steeply through a series of switchbacks that lead to the Table Mountain area and accesses gravel forest service roads. Services road include 35, 3500, 114, 3507, 3517, 3521, 3530, 9712, 9716 and numerous spur roads.

### **The Colville National Forest (GMUs 101, 105, 108, 111, 113, and 117) :**

The Colville National Forest (CNF) has road opportunities for 2014 on all four Ranger Districts. All routes are signed, gated, and locked. Hunters with Disabilities must visit any CNF office or the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) office in Spokane prior to or on their first day of hunting to sign in and receive information, maps and access procedures and permits. Hunters with Disabilities must also have the Disabled Hunter Permit in their possession. The hunter with a disability and one designated hunter companion may carry firearms while using the area. The designated hunter companion may also fill their own tag. All WDFW rules and regulations apply. No firewood cutting or other removal of forest products is allowed. Camping and off-road-vehicle use on these roads may or may not be permitted – check with the Forest Service office before accessing the roads. If camping or off road vehicles are allowed, all pertinent Forest Service rules and regulations will apply. For specific information including CNF office business hours, road locations, maps, and other details, please contact the Colville National Forest Supervisor’s office at (509) 684-7000.

Most areas have deer and some have elk. These are a mix of high mountain areas, clear cuts logging and forested areas. Forest service maps can be purchased at most FS offices. Call the specific FS office for more information.

### **Northeast Spokane INWC (GMU 121) : \* Snow may occur as early as October 31 in the Loomis State Forest.**

Contact the Inland Northwest Wildlife Council at (509) 487- 8552 for more information about private land-owner opportunities on private timberlands. Some are in old logging areas with locked gates and extensive road systems. These areas provide limited access for disabled permit holders to drive motor vehicles into the “walk-in only” areas.

### **DNR NORTHEAST REGION - COLVILLE:**

Loup Loup State Forest North (GMU 233) Access from West Fork road out of Conconully, Salmon Creek road to Loup Loup Canyon road which runs north and south all the way to Highway 20. ATV’s allowed on DNR roads only.

Loup Loup State Forest South (GMU 239) Access from Chilliwist road 1882 off Old Highway 97. On non-gated roads, ATVs allowed on DNR roads only.

Loomis State Forest South (GMU 215) Salmon Creek Road to USFS 200 road at Kerr Camp up to DNR OMF 1000 road.

Loomis State Forest Middle (GMU 215) From Sinlahekin Valley Road to DNR OME 1000.

Loomis State Forest North (GMU 215) OMT 1000 road (Toats Coulee Rd)

### **DNR SOUTHEAST REGION - ELLENSBURG:**

Buck Creek Road System (GMU 578) South of Trout Lake off Highway 141. No ATV’s or motorcycles allowed on trail system.

Ahtanum Multiple Use Area (GMU 368) This is a Green Dot system. Any road marked with a green dot is open to motorized use. Follow Ahtanum road from exit 36 off I-82 for 13 miles to Tampico. Go right on North Fork Ahtanum road. Travel west about 10 miles to the entrance. Camping available.

### **NORTHWEST REGION – SEDRO WOOLLEY:**

*Sauk Prairie Road System – GMU 437* – East of Darrington. From I-5 take exit 208 and head east on Highway 530. Follow 530 approximately 29 miles to Darrington. At the stop sign in Darrington, turn left on Highway 530 to the North. Go approximately .1 miles from the stop sign and turn right on the Sauk Prairie Road. Follow Sauk Prairie Road approximately 5.5 miles to the stop sign at the T in the road. Turn left onto Forest Road.

*Forest Service 18 Road – GMU 437* – Take off from Highway 530 at White Horse Store. Go North on Forest Service mainline road 18. Only street legal motorized vehicles allowed on roads.

*Red Mountain – GMU 407* – North of the town of Kendall, access is from Highway 542 about 1.5 miles East of Kendall.

*Sumas Mountain – GMU 407* – West of Kendall, access is from Highway 542 about 2 miles south of Kendall.

*North Fork Nooksack Area – GMU 418* – Southwest of Kendall, access is from the North Fork Road off the Mosquito Lake Road.

*Middle Fork Nooksack Area – GMU 418* – East of Deming, access is on the USFS Road 38 off the Mosquito Lake Road.

*Van Zandt Dike – GMU 407* – Northeast of Acme, access is from the Mosquito Lake Road about 2 miles East of Highway 9 at Acme.

*Anderson Mountain – GMU 407* – Northwest of Sedro Woolley, access is on the Skarup Road off the Prairie Road about one mile East of old Highway 99.

*Harry Osborn State Forest – GMU 418* – North of the town of Hamilton on Highway 20, take the Muddy Creek Road from the Hamilton Cemetery Road.

### **SOUTH PUGET SOUND REGION - ENUMCLAW:**

*Tahuya State Forest – GMU 633 Belfair* – At the intersection of 300 and old Belfair Highway (Safeway and QFC at the corners) go West on 300 approximately .8 miles to Sand Hill Road and turn right. Go approximately 1.7 miles to the Tiger 2 Road (Blue Gate) on the right. ATV's allowed. May offload just north of the Youth Camp Road at the gravel pit. Take the Overland Trail to the Tiger 2 road for additional roads.

*Elbe Hills State Forest – GMU 654* – Access off Highway 706, turn left at 278<sup>th</sup> street, follow into State Forest. Roads are not gated, bermed or signed “No motorized Use” – they are open to hunt.

### **PACIFIC CASCADE REGION – CASTLE ROCK:**

*Yacolt Burn State Forest – GMU 568* Access from Dole Valley Road, NE Rawson Road, NE Berry Road, NE Livingston Road, Ammeter Road, NE 412<sup>th</sup>, Skamania Mines Road, North Fork Road, Washougal River Road, Skaar Road, and Carson Road – all roads behind closed gates are walk in only for hunting purposes.

*Capitol State Forest – GMU 663* Access from Hwy 8 at Rock Candy Trailhead, Waddell Creek Road, Bourdeaux road, D-Line and Porter Creek road off Highway 12. All non gated roads are open to hunting.

*Winston Creek Block – GMU 520* – Access off Highway 12 onto Winston Creek/Salmon Creek roads.

*Deep Creek – GMU 501* – D 1000 and D 6000 roads at the end of the Deep Creek Road, Access off Cooks Hill Road, D 5000. A couple of these gates may be subject to closure. Contact DNR.

### **OLYMPIC REGION - FORKS:**

*Olympic Experimental Forest - GMU 615* – Access off Highway 101 on Clearwater road to the South and Hoh Mainline to the North. Roads not gated, bermed or signed “No Motorized Use” – they are open to hunt.

## ***Hunters are Feeling the Pinch of Reduced Access***

Despite the efforts of WDFW, the acreage of private lands available to the hunter has declined over time. Several major landowners have begun to charge fees for access. This has been especially true in western Washington where major timberland owners have begun to charge access fees and limit the number of hunters they allow. This common practice in other parts of the US is new to our state and may eventually cause hunting to be more crowded on public lands or limit the ability of some to participate in hunting. Incentives offered by WDFW to landowners in the past to address landowner costs associated with providing access may no longer be as effective when landowners seek to derive income from hunting access. WDFW has and will continue to seek new approaches and encourage landowners to keep the cost to hunters low and not limit the number of hunters allowed. Hunters should be aware that landowner fee programs have expanded over the past year and are known to impact access in the following Game Management Units: 501, 506, 520, 524, 550, 556, 612, 615, 642, 648, 651, 653, 654, 658, 660, 667, 672, and 681. Substantial blocks of land in these areas are leased or require hunters to purchase permits to access private timberlands. You may call the WDFW ADA Program with ADA access concerns about your permit.

## ***Feel Free to Hunt and Register to Hunt Program***

The *GOHUNT* online interactive mapping system is a great tool for persons with disabilities. Access to private lands is a privilege. Much of the big game hunting in Washington occurs on private forestlands. WDFW works with timberland owners to maintain access but many of these landowners provide access without direct assistance from WDFW. Hunters can help maintain access by respecting the landowner and following their rules. Most forest landowners post access rules at entry points. Hunters are not sure of the rules, the following are good guidelines.

- Obey all posted signs
- Leave gates as you found them.
- Pack out your trash.
- Be courteous
- No camping
- No ORV's
- No fires
- Drive only on maintained roads if open to motorized access.
- An opened gate does not mean the road is open to motorized access, read the signs.
- If possible, avoid active haul routes and logging operations.
- Private forest lands are usually closed to public access during hours of darkness.
- No target shooting or plinking
- No wood cutting



Landowners may not have staff on hand to answer all of the phone calls they would receive regarding hunting access. Therefore, hunters are encouraged to contact WDFW regional offices about access to private lands prior to contacting the landowner. Some have hotlines or web addresses that can be provided. ## ***Hunt By Reservation Program***

In 2013 WDFW launched a new program to help landowners manage hunting access on their land. The program allows hunters to reserve a site, sometimes shared with a few others, for one to several days depending on the site. The program objectives include providing quality hunting opportunities and reducing the need for direct guidance of hunters by the landowner. Hunters can access property information and create a reservation account at: [http://wdfw.wa.gov/hunting/hunting\\_access/private\\_lands/search.php](http://wdfw.wa.gov/hunting/hunting_access/private_lands/search.php). WDFW expects the number and distribution of reservation sites to expand over time, but other options such as *Feel Free to Hunt* offered to landowners will continue to be used.



- \* If selected, you may hunt in any open unit during all general seasons starting with archery and continuing on for muzzleloader and modern firearm. You must comply with all rules and weapon restrictions for the season in effect. You may also apply for any weapon type special hunting permits.
  - \* To apply you must purchase an application at a license vendor, online at [fishhunt.dfw.wa.gov](http://fishhunt.dfw.wa.gov), or by calling 1-866-246-9453. You do not need to purchase a deer or elk license and tag before applying for a multiple season permit.
  - \* If you are applying as an individual your application is automatically submitted.
  - \* If you would like to apply as a group (maximum of 2 people), you must submit your application online at: [wdfw.wa.gov/hunting/permits](http://wdfw.wa.gov/hunting/permits) or by calling 1-877-945-3492.
  - \* If submitting your application, please use hunt choice #1888 for Deer, 2888 for Elk, and 4999 for Points Option for both species. See pages 88-90 for more information on applying for special permits.
  - \* 8,500 deer and 1,000 elk permits will be available.
  - \* Elk multi-season permit holders may hunt eastern and western Washington.
  - \* The Bag limit does not increase. Bag limit is consistent with the game management unit or area restrictions.
  - \* If selected, the costs for both resident and non-resident multi-season tags are: \$139.10 for deer, and \$182.00 for elk in addition to the cost of your original deer or elk license.
  - \* Please note that if you purchased your license and tag before you were selected, your general season tag must be surrendered before a multiple season tag can be purchased.
  - \* If selected, multi-season tags will be available to purchase any time prior to September 1.
  - \* Drawing results will be available online in April and winners will be notified by mail.
